

Ten Ideas for Catching Fire

Leaving a rain-soaked Oklahoma prairie and arriving at the Earthrise Retreat Center in the dry California coastal mountains of Petaluma was a sort of induction to the *Catching Fire ITP International Conference*, held May 15-17th. The weekend was a coming together of flame and kindling, wisdom and intellect, history and future.

Coming from an engineering and medical background, I must admit that some discussions were too sun-bright for me, but after reflecting on the entire weekend, all speakers effectively used prisms that offered a rainbow of insights.



Below are ten ideas I recorded during the conference that have acted as my personal pieces of kindling currently catching fire on this ongoing journey of transformation.

- All aspects of life are in flux and movement. We are breaking the spell of solidity.
- Evolution in areas such as biology, politics, religion and culture are illuminating more broadly by enhanced concepts and new integrations.
- Tipping points have evolved from a slow crescendo based on mass and number, to a rapid crescendo based on intensity of conversation and communication.
- To receive the divine, empty the mind and let loose of heaviness. Don't escape the world, but come to alignment with it. We have a choice to be open and allow healing.
- "The first half of our life is biography, and the second half autobiography." Jung
- "I have a body, but I am not my body"- Hindu, and Buddhist.
- The flame is latent in the log. We can all catch fire. One flame, to one flame, to another flame to fire.
- Intentionality allows receptivity to grace. Our emotional charge can divert intentionality and receptivity.
- Consider the "adjacent possible." Take smart risks, build on what is possible, don't overreach and go for the very small but achievable.
- Notice how "what I know may get the best of me." Imagination and fantasy are necessary to visualize the outcome. This enhances the power of affirmation practice, central to ITP theory and philosophy.
